



Sports Premium Statement 2016-2017

Background

The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary schools to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. The purpose of the funding is that schools will have to spend the sport funding in improving their provision of PE but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Allocation

Each school will receive £8,000 plus an extra £5 per pupil each year for the next two years - here at Walmley Junior School that means around £9,795 a year. The money can **only** be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Accountability

Schools will be held to account for how they spend the Sport Funding. Ofsted has strengthened its coverage of sport and PE within the Inspectors' Handbook and supporting guidance, so that schools and inspectors know how sport and PE will be assessed in future as part of the schools' overall provision offered. The Leadership Team and Physical Education Co-ordinator at Walmley will regularly monitor and assess the impact of this funding.

Impact of Sports Funding – Inter-house competitive sporting events

All pupils in Year 3-6 are placed within four houses (Red, Blue, Green and Yellow). All pupils have at least one opportunity to represent their house in a termly inter-house sporting competition (Dodgeball, Rounders and Football). The winning house is awarded a trophy. This allows all of our children to participate in at least one competitive sporting even throughout the academic year.

Impact of Sports Funding – Sports Coach CPD

Our school sports coach has been able to attend a variety of different CPD training courses throughout the year to extend her knowledge, understanding and teaching skills. These skills have then been evident in her daily teaching and the children have really benefitted from this. This has positively impacted on the learning that takes place in Physical Education lessons and her good practices have also been shared with other members of staff.

Impact of Sports Funding – Young Leader's Scheme

Twelve Year 5 children took part in 6 week block of theoretical and practical sessions ran by Sports Active to develop their skills as a leader. It became evidently clear that the children developed their organisation, communication and teamwork skills, as well as helping to build confidence and self-esteem as they took on responsibilities of leading their peers and younger children. At lunch time, the Young Leaders encouraged children to take part in games, and as a result, a higher percentage of children were physically active.

Impact of Sports Funding – Wilson Stuart Active Society

Children have had greater opportunities to participate at a high level in a widening range of sports both locally and nationally at a competitive level. This has promoted a love for Physical Education and children have been able to take part in sports that they would not normally participate in.

Impact of Sports Funding – Whole school Tennis focus 'Walmley Wimbledon'

All pupils in Years 3-6 take part in our annual Walmley Wimbledon. Each year group spends a day working with tennis coaches from local clubs. The coaches teach key skills and then organise a knock out competition in the afternoon like a mini Wimbledon. The winners and runner up for boys and girls are presented with medals in a presentation ceremony. This continues to promote a love for tennis at Walmley Juniors and many children take up tennis as a sport outside of school due to this annual event.

Impact of Sports Funding – 'Try something new' in collaboration with cluster schools

We worked in close partnership with 15 local sporting clubs and offered 30 children in Year 3 an opportunity to try a range of new sports. This event was held at Walmley Junior School. This sustainable event has encourage many children across the participating schools to take up a new sport outside of the school's provision and find a sport for life.

Impact of Sports Funding – School Games 'Bronze Award'

Throughout the year, we have provided our children with as many opportunities to participate and compete in physical activity as possible. Our achievements have been recognised and rewarded with the 'School Games Bronze Award'. This is something we are proud of and we are now working towards the 'Silver Award'.
