Arrangements for September opening

Dear parents/carers,

We are very pleased to now give you further information on what September will look like for parents and pupils of Walmley Junior School. You can access all of these arrangements on the **Home Page of the school website**. This will be updated, if necessary, by 1pm every Monday throughout the summer break and we will respond to any changes in government guidance in due course. This will be the only way school will communicate with parents during the holidays. Please do not email or call school during this period as we do not have the resources to respond.

We are looking forward to welcoming all children back on **Wednesday 2nd September** and would ask you discuss these new arrangements with your child before they return.

School	All children will need to be in the correct, full uniform when they return – see website for details. No
uniform/equipment	fabric or trainers with coloured logos will be permitted. They will need their P.E kit from the very first
	day. Children should bring their own small pencil case (to fit in their tray) and any child who has
	progressed to writing in pen must provide their own. All uniform and equipment should be clean and
	named.
Social distancing	Children will be arranged in year group 'bubbles'. They will learn together in classes/teaching groups
	and will be able to socialise at break and lunch times. They will not be mixing with other year groups
	throughout the day and staff will be assigned to work in certain year groups. Children will be
	encouraged to remain at least 1m wherever possible. Tables will be arranged in rows with all pupils
	facing the front of the room. There will be no whole school assemblies for the foreseeable future.
Hygiene	Children will be reminded to wash their hands at regular intervals and before eating. Hand gel will be
	provided in every classroom and at the entrances/exits of school. Children will not go to the toilet in
	groups but will be allowed just one at a time throughout the school day, as necessary. Full details of our
	practices can be found in our revised risk assessment on the school website.
Start of day	Children will be able to flow freely in to school each morning between 8.40am and 9.00am and will go
	directly to their classroom, entering school through their assigned entrance. Please remind your child
	which door to come through before they arrive at school.

	Year 4 – Main entrance
	Year 5 – Library entrance
	Year 6 – Year 6 entrance
End of day	Year group bubbles will leave school from their assigned exits at staggered times:
	 Year 3 and Year 4 will be dismissed at 3.20pm
	Year 5 will be dismissed at 3.25pm
	Year 6 will be dismissed at 3.30pm
	Please try to arrive as close to the assigned time as possible to prevent too many people gathering at
	the school gate.
Break times	Children will have 2 outside breaks each day and will only be permitted to socialise with their year
	group bubble. The playground will be zoned and games that involve touching equipment will not be
	allowed. Breaks will be supervised by staff within their bubble. Please provide your child with a healthy
	snack and bottle of water as their lunch time could be later than they are used to.

Lunchtime	Children who choose to bring their own sandwiches will eat at their desk in their classroom. If your child requires a hot school lunch, a time slot and zone will be available for each year group bubble to eat in the hall. Each bubble will then all be allowed to go outside to play in their assigned zone.
Earlybirds	Earlybirds will reopen on Wednesday 2nd September for any parents who require this. Year group bubbles will be kept separate wherever possible whilst they attend Earlybirds and social distancing will be promoted. Communicating with school	Please do not come on to the school site without a prior appointment. These can be made by calling or emailing school.
In the event of an outbreak	If a child or adult displays any symptoms of Covid-19, they will be isolated and sent home immediately. We will advise that they should be tested as a matter of urgency and ask them to inform school of the outcome. In the event of a pupil or member of staff receiving a positive test result, all pupils and staff in the year group bubble will be sent home and asked to isolate for 14 days, in line with government guidance. Remote learning will be provided for all pupils in the event of a bubble closing or local lockdown.

We appreciate that September will be a time of change for all of our children and their families and we will be reviewing our practices regularly to make school the safest environment that it can be. We are very much looking forward to seeing you all in September and wish you a safe and happy summer break!
