Morning drop off & Parking

It is evident that some parents/carers are still not using the pedestrian crossing and warden, and children are sometimes sent across the busy road by themselves. It is really not worth the risk and we have seen nasty accidents in the past. We would urge you to help us teach children to always search for, and use, the safest place to cross so that they make the right choices for themselves in the future.

If you could walk to school, we ask that you support us by doing so. If you need to come by car, please park further away and walk a little more, as this will help ensure children's safety. This will also help ensure local residents can access their own driveways and pedestrians can use pavements safely. We have also had complaints about parents who are playing very loud music when they park (or sit in their cars waiting for their children) which is affecting nearby residents, particularly those working from home. Please also avoid leaving car engines running for long periods whilst dropping off / collecting children. We would be grateful if you could be considerate and mindful of these issues, please.

Parent contact details

We continue to communicate by texts and emails. Could we remind parents that it is your responsibility to inform the school office when your contact details change. School should have a minimum of three contact phone numbers to ensure we can get hold of someone at home in an emergency. If you change address, we need to see a copy of your most up to date council tax bill as proof in order for us to make the change.

Dinner Money

Dinner money is £12.50 per week (i.e. £2.50 per meal). If you prefer to pay for the half-term in advance, it will be **£85.00** for Tuesday 6th September to Friday 21st October. Please ensure that payments are made promptly using our online system. Outstanding dinner money invoices are sent by email and we wish to remind you that dinner money **should always be paid in advance not arrears**. We hope that your child will have school dinners, but please remember to give the school office one week's notice in writing of any changes to your child's lunch arrangements.

Hotdog Lunch - Wednesday 28th September

We would like to give the children who normally have sandwiches the opportunity to have a lunch on Wednesday 28th September. If you would like your child to have a lunch the cost is £2.50. **Payment for Hot dog lunches should be made using Scopay online payment system.** Hot dog lunch can be found in 'Products' then 'Hot dog Lunch'. We are asking for payment to be made in advance, this will ensure your child receives a lunch on that day. Payment should be made no later than **Friday 16th September. Please only pay £2.50 for the September Hotdog lunch and refrain from making overpayments as it causes issues on our payment system.**

When we return to school after half term we will be on **Week 1**. Menus are available to view on the school website.

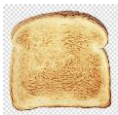
Cake Sale

We are asking for payment to be made in advance for the half-term only, please do not overpay, this will ensure your child receives cake on a Friday. For the half-term it will be **£4.20**. Payment should be made no later than **Sunday 4th September 2021. Once the deadline date has passed there will be no opportunity to order, so please do not contact the school office to ask.** As we are sure you can appreciate Mrs Bean has to ensure she has the necessary ingredients which is why we have a deadline.

We are asking for payment to be made in advance for the half-term only, this will ensure your child receives toast on their nominated day. For the half-term it will be **£2.80**. Payment should be made no later than **Sunday 4th September 2021. Once the deadline date has passed there will be no opportunity to order, so please do not contact the school office to ask.** As we are sure you can appreciate Mrs Bean has to ensure she has the necessary supplies which is why we have a deadline.

Payments to school

Can we please remind parents that we are a cashless school, and all payments should be made using our online payments system <https://www.scopay.com/walmley-jun> We do not hold any cash in school and therefore cannot refund any payments made in cash that subsequently need to be returned. **Please note that any cash payments made, that need to be returned will sit on your child's account for you to use for a future trip/event.**

Water Bottles

Please provide your child with a named water bottle. The children always have access to water and they will need their bottle in school every day to keep them sufficiently hydrated. Please do not send them in with squash. We do not have spare water bottles in school.

Earlybirds Bookings

If you need to make an emergency booking, it must be made before 12 o'clock on that day. In addition, if you cancel an Earlybirds session after 12 o'clock, you will have to collect your child from Earlybirds as they may have already been taken there by a member of the Earlybirds team.

PE Kits

From September, we will no longer have one PE day but will go back to having two lessons on different days of the week (one long session is proving too much for some children). **They will therefore need to have their full named PE kit in school all week, please.**

School Uniform

There has unfortunately been a noticeable decline in the standard of uniform, particularly for footwear, with some children wearing trainers rather than shoes. We understand that manufacturers are selling styles that are a hybrid between the two, but we would ask you to ensure that your child's footwear is leather/leather look, smart and plain black, please. Fabric shoes or coloured logos/soles are not acceptable. Earrings should also be small studs only, with no hoops or dangly ones that are a safety hazard. Except for a watch, no other jewellery (incl. friendship bracelets) is allowed in school.

Please ensure that your child comes to school with a school tie and a waterproof coat every day. Our website gives full details of our uniform requirements if needed.

All items should be named so that lost items can be returned easily. Once again, we have a lost property area that is full of unnamed items of clothing and belongings, which is a waste of your money. We would appreciate your support with this.
