As we are sure you can appreciate, Mrs Bean has to ensure she has the necessary ingredients, which is why we have a deadline.

Toast sales will start w/c Monday 4<sup>th</sup> September. Payment should be paid in advance using Scopay online payment. Toast can be found under 'Products' then 'toast'. We are asking for payment to be made in advance for the Summer Term only, this will ensure your child receives toast on their nominated day. For the whole of Autumn Term the cost will be £6.00. For Year 3 pupils the cost will be £5.60 due to the INSET Day on Monday 4<sup>th</sup> September and for Year 4 pupils the cost will be £5.60 due to the Botanical Gardens Trip on Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> October. Payment should be made no later than Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> September 2023. Once the deadline date has passed, there will be no opportunity to order, so please do not contact the school office to ask. As we are sure you can appreciate Mrs Bean has to ensure she has the necessary supplies which is why we have a deadline.

# Hotdog Lunch - Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> September

We would like to give the children who normally have sandwiches the opportunity to have a lunch on Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> September. If you would like your child to have a lunch, the cost is £2.60. **Payment for Hot dog lunches should be made using Scopay online payment system.** Hot dog lunch can be found in 'Products' then 'Hot dog lunch'. We are asking for payment to be made in advance; this will ensure your child receives a lunch on that day. Payment should be made no later than Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> September. Please only pay £2.60 for the March Hotdog lunch and refrain from making overpayments as it causes issues on our payment system. *If your child normally has a lunch on a Wednesday, you do not need to pay* 





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## Payments to school

Can we please remind parents that we are a cashless school, and all payments should be made using our online payments system <u>https://www.scopay.com/walmley-jun</u> We do not hold any cash in school and therefore cannot refund any payments made in cash that subsequently need to be returned. **Please note that any cash payments made, that need to be returned will sit on your child's account for you to use for a future trip/event.** 

### **Dinner Money**

Dinner money is £13.00 per week (i.e. £2.60 per meal). If you prefer to pay for the half-term in advance, it will be **£101.40** for Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> September to Friday 27<sup>th</sup> October. Please ensure that payments are made promptly using our online system. Outstanding dinner money invoices are sent by email and we wish to remind you that dinner money **should always be paid in advance not arrears**. We hope that your child will have school dinners, but please remember to give the school office one week's notice in writing of any changes to your child's lunch arrangements. The Autumn Term will start on Week 1 of the menus.

#### **Free School Meals**

Changes have been made as to how we collect information for Free School Meals. You no longer have to come into school to complete paperwork and bring in evidence as it is all done by simply registering online at <u>https://www.cloudforedu.org.uk/ofsm/birmingham</u>. You only ever need to register once and school will automatically be updated of eligibility or any changes of eligibility; this information is data protected as per the terms shown.
